### New Benches

With funding from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) and working alongside the biodiversity group, the parish council has installed two metal benches in the community nature reserve. All paths have also been cleared.

## Allotment Extension Update

The new ground has been ploughed and better weather is awaited to allow rotavation. It is likely that the area of each plot will have to be redefined given that the extensive intrusion of tree roots from the footpath side could make growing difficult. The final decision will be made after rotavation.

# Flooding

Some village flooding caused by recent heavy rain was attended and dealt with by the Flood Wardens. There was surface water flooding in three areas of the village, signs were placed but, fortunately, most had gone within an hour. Cllr Collings has reported further drain blockages to Nottinghamshire County Council which will be highlighted in the council's programmes. A fully equipped flood store has been established at Zouch and two new wardens have joined the Sutton Bonington team.
